Campus Kids

Four-Week Session I and II

CAMPUS KIDS — SESSION I OR II (AGE 6)

Friendly Froglets program will allow our little ones the opportunity to play constructively, learn the importance of socialization, sharing, allow them to adjust to new environments and become more independent. Campers will follow a daily schedule which will enable them to be active and to enjoy the same great fun as the older campers, but at a more relaxed pace.

CAMPUS KIDS — SESSION I OR II (AGES 7-13)

Camp College offers your child an enriching alternative to the traditional summer day camp. Campers combine study in a variety of stimulating subject areas that emphasize intellectual growth and skills development with the fun of recreational activities. Participants choose up to six different "courses" and most courses meet 55 minutes daily for all four weeks of each session.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

All children ages 6-13 on September 30, 2021 are eligible. For one week programs up to age 16, refer to pages 20-36.

WHEN IS IT?

Session 1: June 21-July 16 (FOUR weeks; four or five days per week) Monday-Thursday or Monday to Friday.

Session II: July 19-Aug 13 (FOUR weeks; four or five days per week) Monday-Thursday or Monday to Friday.

FRIDAY FUN DAYS

The perfect way for campers to end the week. **Friday Fun Days** are available **ONLY** for those campers who have chosen the Monday-Friday option. See class information on page 16 for Campus Kids.

EARLY BIRD BEFORE-CAMP...SUPERVISED ACTIVITIES FROM 7:15-8AM!

For those who must drop children off prior to 8am, we offer an Early Bird Before-Camp. Children enrolled in this optional program may be dropped off as early as 7:15am. Experienced camp staff will supervise early arrivals. Daily registrations not permitted. To register, use the application form on page 49. NOTE: Children not enrolled in the Early Bird Before-Camp program may be dropped off as early as 8am.

AFTER-CAMP

Although classes run from 8:30am to 4pm each day, campers may be picked up as late as 6pm. Children enrolled in this optional program may remain on campus after 4pm. They will join Camp College After-Camp supervised activities, including optional recreational swimming. Daily registrations not permitted. See page 48 for details.

A \$25 fee, every 15 minutes, will be charged for children who arrive earlier than 7:15am or remain on campus after 6pm.

WHEN DO I REGISTER?

Registration begins March 1. Register early and avoid the disappointment of filled classes.

HOW DO I REGISTER? Until further notice all camp applications must be submitted by mail. Mail the appropriate registration form in this brochure, all forms from pages 37-51, and current immunization record with your full payment, to the address indicated. The tuition fee includes all camp activities and materials unless noted otherwise in individual course descriptions.

Payment in full is due at time of registration. Deadline is two weeks prior to the camp start date. Avoid the \$20 late fee...Register Early! There are additional charges for the Before and After-Camp care programs.

Campers may bring their own lunches or purchase meals and beverages at the College cafeteria

WHAT IS THE REFUND POLICY?

A \$100 processing fee will be imposed for withdrawal in the Campus Kids four-week program. A one-time \$10 non-refundable continuing studies summer registration fee will be applied to all students.

Refunds will be granted only when written notice of a camper's withdrawal is received no later than ten business days before the start of each camp session. NO REFUNDS THEREAFTER. Telephone withdrawals will not be accepted.





Campus Kids Course Descriptions

Unless otherwise noted, course descriptions are for either age group (7-9) or (10-13)

What activities will be offered?

- Campers choose six different age-appropriate courses per session.
- Parents should review child's choices, especially to ensure classes are not duplicated in Session I and II.
 There is a \$20 fee for each requested schedule change.
- Most courses meet for one 55-minute period daily during each camp session.
- The registration form for your child's age and session lists the courses available to your camper.
- All classes must be selected from one age group list. Classes from both age groups may not be combined.
- NOTE: We will make every effort to schedule you according to your first choices. We will use alternatives only if others are full or cancelled. The college reserves the right to cancel courses with insufficient enrollment and to limit class size. Limited space available.

IMPORTANT: Optional Before Camp and After-Camp programs provide supervised activities from 7:15-8am and from 4-6pm. For the convenience of working parents, children who arrive on campus either before 8am or remain after 4pm must participate in Before and After-Camp supervised activities. ADVANCED ARCHERY (AGES 10-13)

Prerequisite: Beginner Archery

Draw, Aim, Anchor, Fire! This class helps you refine your hand-eye coordination, form and technique. Learn advanced skills to be sure you hit the target every time.

ADVANCED JUGGLING (AGES 10-13)

Prerequisite: Juggling for Beginners or equivalent skills. Practice, practice, practice! If you've already taken a juggling class and are ready to move up a level, try Advanced Juggling! Learn 3 ball tricks, juggling 4 balls, rings, clubs, and passing tricks. Show off your skills in our Camp College Grand Finale! (1st session)

ANIMAL ART (AGES 7-9)

Create art inspired by animals with drawing, painting, sculptures, and even recycled materials. Learn how to make habitat jar drawings, totem poles, bird cage sculptures, jellyfish watercolor paintings, soda bottle piggy bank sculptures, crazy animal books and more.

ARTISTIC IMPRESSIONS (AGES 10-13)

Create a unique imitation of famous artists using our own style. Using watercolors, campers will paint on canvas and rocks. Campers will recreate art from famous artists like Georgia O'Keeffe, Jackson Pollack and more.

KOOKY SCIENCE (AGES 7-9)


Do you want to be a "mad scientist"? Grab your lab coat and goggles so that we can explore light, sound and other kooky concepts in this kidfriendly science lab.






